News From The Principal

Kia ora members of the Old Boys' Association

I write this as preparations are well underway for our Senior Prizegiving, which by all accounts is one of the best nights of the year. I'm sure some of you can recall your final weeks at school and the mixed emotions that many of our current boys have about the next phase of their lives. There still remains a strong pull for many of our boys to further their education at University and many of them have secured significant scholarships from Universities the length of the country. Equally, there are a huge number of boys who have secured apprenticeships and jobs locally and nationally, which is also a very fine achievement and sets them on a continued pathway of learning. We always appreciate Old Boys coming back to school to keep us up to date on where they have gone and what they have been doing. Needless to say the stories are many and varied.

On the subject of keeping us up to date, I am delighted to have Laureen True join the WBHS team. Laureen will be assisting the OBA with their promotional material and continuing to build on the database, so you can expect to have regular communication from her.

From a school perspective, our building plans are progressing well and we are in the developed design phase now. Procurement for our construction team will take place towards the end of the year and we are on track to begin construction mid-2020. We will have some 3D modelling of the new site available soon and we will post graphics of the new buildings as they become available. It has been great having many old boys involved in the planning so far with geotech exploration, engineering advice and other professional services that are helping us progress to the next phase.

As a first stage, we are resurfacing the tennis courts with an all-weather surface, and installing lighting so that come winter next year, we have a facility that enables our sports teams to train and our PE classes to function well. Unfortunately the courts are 20m too narrow to accommodate a full sized hockey turf, but it will be ideal for practice.

One of our frustrations is that we are not entitled to build a new gymnasium (under the Ministry allocation), nor can any of the funds be used to upgrade Carruth House, however we have an agreement with the Ministry to build an auditorium/hall that will seat 1300, so that we can finally have whole school assemblies and even Senior Prizegiving in our own hall. This will be a fabulous facility - not only for the school but the local community.

We will have to think carefully about how we raise funds to upgrade the facilities at Carruth House and by way of a start, we hope to have a working bee towards the end of the year after



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Junior Prizegiving on the 10th December to give the place a spruce up. If you are interested in helping out with this by providing materials or labour, please contact me.

Our new building plans have presented an opportunity to look at the school brand and in the coming weeks, you will be asked for your feedback (as an old boy) on two options - to ensure a consistent branding for the school moving forward. We will also consult the staff and current students on their thoughts.

On staffing news, Matt Lawson has been appointed Acting Deputy Principal while Keir Morrison is on sabbatical in term 1, 2020. Matt is a proud Old Boy of the school and it's great to see his progress from student to D.P. evolve. We have a small number of staff leaving at the end of the year and have made some fantastic appointments for 2020 and beyond.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the OBA Executive and the Endowment Trust for their ongoing support and hard work, not only for the Association, but the boys at school. We are very fortunate to have such capable men leading the organisation and on a personal note I am most appreciative of their support.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish all of you a safe and happy holiday season and all the best for 2020.

Here are some of the sporting highlights from yet another busy term.

Gymnastics - Nationals were held October 2-5th in Auckland. Ryan Townsend who has been selected to represent New Zealand at the upcoming Valeri Liukin and Houston Invitational competitions. These are to be held in Texas in January 2020. He's only the second male gymnast from Northland ever picked for an international tour.

Cycling - National School Road Championships 28-30th Sept in Manawatu. Trevor Coetzee was placed 6th.

Clay Target Shooting - NZSS NZ Clay Target Championships 28-30th Sept Hamilton. William Hamlin was picked for the North Island team to compete against the South Island teamwinning with 218 points against 200.

Basketball - NZSS Schick AA National Championships 30th Sept – 5th October Palmerston North. WBHS placed 15th.



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Surfing - NZ National Scholastic Surfing Championships 7th – 11th October Raglan. Semifinalist Tai Erceg – Gray, finalist Izaak Hayes and Northland achieved 5th place. Max Brunker and Billy Gilbert also competed but weren't able to complete their divisions due to lack of waves.

Snowboarding - NISS Snowboarding Championship 23rd – 25th Sept Mt Ruapehu, Ohakune Silver was awarded to Rory Saunders for Slope, Style and Jump with Tricks

Squash – Riley-Jack Vette-Blomquist took out the under-17 boys' division, winning in four games at the finals of the New Zealand Junior National Individual competition held in Auckland on 10 October.

Hockey - WBHS student and Northland U15 Hockey team captain, Javahn Jones, and his team are national champions. They won five of their six games to take out the trophy for the first time in its 26-year history.

Cricket - WBHS cricketers - Michael Krige, Vinnie Von Mulert, Brandon Peck, Luke Trigg, Sam Webb were chosen for the Northland Secondary Schools touring squad. The development cricket team, flew to Melbourne in what was the second tour of its kind, the combined secondary schools team played seven 50-over matches and one 40-over match across the 12 days with games.

A Story From the Old Days - We loved PE

The rules as practised were: all kids had to swim. Doctor's certificates were largely ignored. This was not a school for wimps.

If you left your togs at home, Tough.

You were not allowed to swim in anything other than togs, as the unauthorised clothing might release threads and pills which would block the filters and the pumps.

If you swam without clothes on, you were caned at the end of the class for leaving your togs at home.

It was quite embarrassing if your swimming classes were about interval. Because then the maids at Carruth Boarding House went out on to the balcony, to smoke their cigarettes during their smoko - and they looked down on the swimming pool as they drank their tea. How they laughed at the line-up of male bare bums waiting to be caned.

At one time the swimming pool at Girls High was out of operation. So the 2 schools did a deal and the girls came over to Boys High for their swimming, complete with their instructor / teacher. A long rope was hung down the middle of the pool. Boys' one side, girls swam the other side. Never the twain to meet.

But as I recall there were no concessions made by WBHS teachers.

Still - if you forgot your togs, you swam in the nude.

Still - you got caned at the end of the session as a reminder to bring your togs next week.
